Parish Council: To serve on the Parish Council, you must be an Orthodox Christian 18 years of age or older, have been an Orthodox Christian at least **two** years, have belonged to this parish for at least **one** year, partake of Confession and Communion at least once a year, live in a manner consistent with the Orthodox Faith, and participate in financial stewardship of the parish.

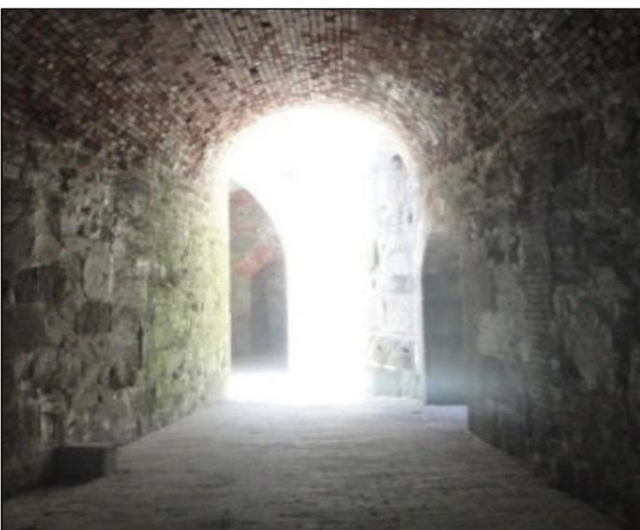
TODAY: PAN-ORTHODOX VESPERS, 4:00 PM, ST. MARY'S ORTHODOX CHURCH, PAINTED POST

SCRIPTURE READINGS

EPISTLE Hebrews 4:14-5:6 Brethren: Having a great High Priest Who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast to the confession. For we do not have a High Priest Who cannot have compassion on our infirmities, but one tempted in all things like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest taken from among men is ordained for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins; who can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also beset by weakness. Because of this he is required, as for the people, so also for himself, to offer for sins. And no man takes this honor unto himself, but he that is called by God, as was Aaron. So Christ also did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but He that said unto Him: "Thou art My Son, this day have I begotten Thee." As He said also in another place: "Thou art a priest forever after the order of Melchizedek."

GOSPEL Mark 8:34-9:1 At that time, when Jesus had called the people to Himself, with His disciples also, He said to them, "Whoever desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And He said to them, "Assuredly, I say to you that there are some standing here who will not taste death till they see the kingdom of God present with power."

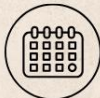
