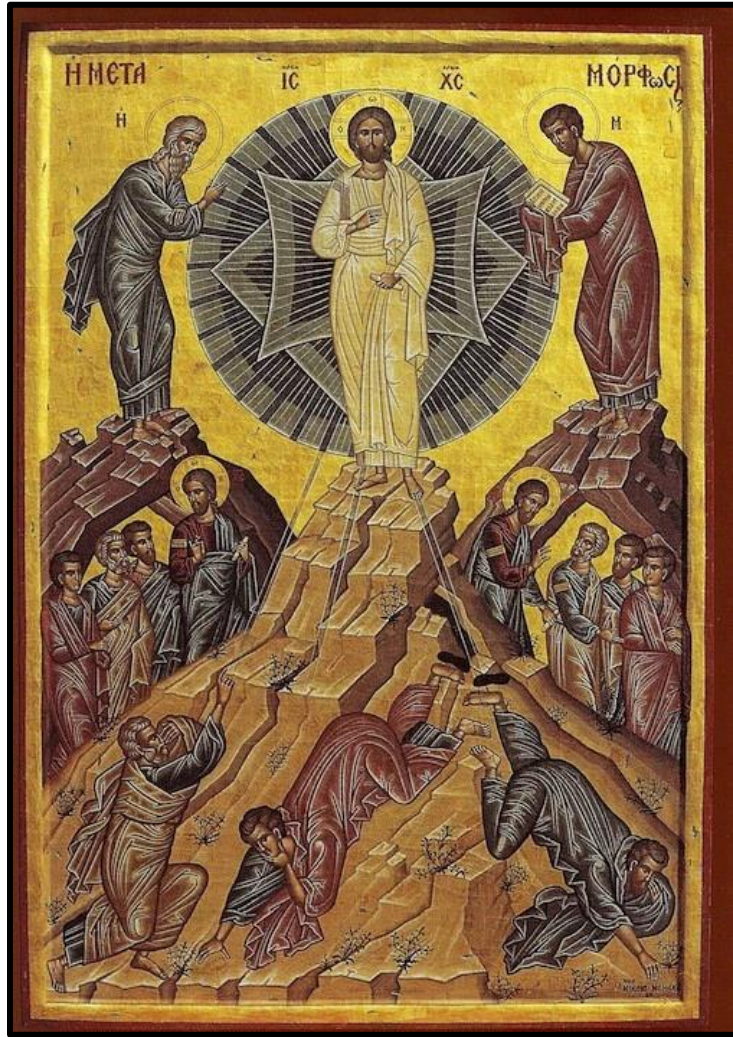

ON THE FEAST OF THE DORMITION OF THE MOTHER OF GOD, MONDAY, AUGUST 15:

On Monday, August 15, instead of having the Liturgy here, **everyone is invited to the Divine Liturgy at the Church of the Dormition, our Diocesan parish in Binghamton**, located at 54 Baxter Street, Binghamton. The Liturgy at the Binghamton parish will begin at **9:00 AM**.

Remember: The Dormition Fast continues until the Divine Liturgy on Monday, August 15, the Great Feast of the Dormition (Falling-Asleep) of the Most-Holy Theotokos, the Ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of God. During the fast we are called to abstain from meat, from dairy as best we can, and from unnecessary partaking of food, drink, entertainment, and spiritually unproductive conversation and conduct.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

EPISTLE: 1 Corinthians 1:10-18 Brethren: I appeal to you, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no dissensions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brethren. What I mean is that each one of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I am thankful that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius; lest any one should say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas. Beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized any one else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power. For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

GOSPEL: Matthew 14:14-22 At that time, when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, His disciples came to Him, saying, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is already late. Send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food." But Jesus said to them, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." And they said to Him, "We have here only five loaves and two fish." He said, "Bring them here to Me." Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass. And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitudes. So they all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments that remained. Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away.
